



## You will need;

Card/paper

Paint

Pens/pencils

Scissors

## Optional;

Other decoration

Googly eyes.

## Directions

- Do your handprint
- Leave to dry
- Add detail of eyes, teeth and back ridges.
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.



## You will need;

2 x Card tube

Card/paper

Way to colour in.

Pen/ pencil

Glue/ tape

Scissors

## Optional;

Coloured card/paper

Other decoration

Pipe cleaner

Googly eyes.

## Directions

- Colour in your card tubes.
- Cut out 2 long triangles and 2 strips for the legs from paper/card– colour in if necessary.
- Cut out a colour two small circles to make the eyes.
- We used a pipe cleaner to make the back of the crocodile, you can use paper or card if you don't have pipe cleaners– cut out a jagged strip and colour in.
- If using paint– leave to dry before assembling.
- Cut a mouth out of one tube using a zig zag motion to 2/3 of the way down the tube. Attach the 2 tubes together.
- Attach the eyes, legs and back ridge (paper or pipe cleaner) to the body
- Make the tail by attaching the 2 triangles to the inside of the tube, attach together to create a point.
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.



### You will need;

Card or paper

Way to colour in.

Pen/ pencil

Glue/ tape

Scissors

### Optional;

Paper plate

Split pin

Googly eyes

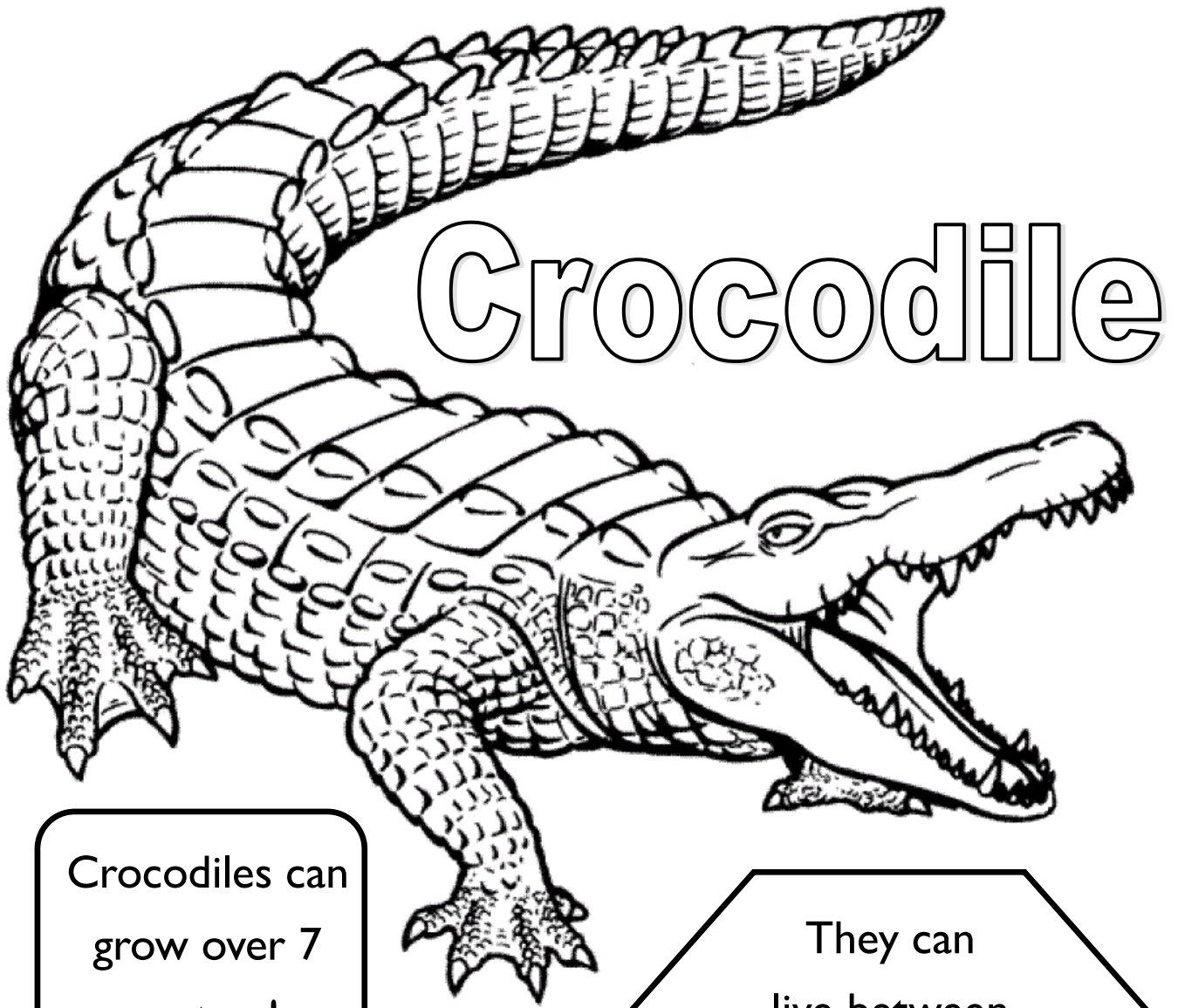
Glitter

Other decorations.

### Directions

- Colour in the whole of the face (paper plate or a piece of card/paper cut to size)
- Cut out 2 small circles and colour to make eyes
- Cut out two jagged strips of paper to make the teeth
- If using paint– leave to dry before assembling.
- Cut the face in half and then to shape as shown above
- Glue on the eyes teeth
- If you have one you can use a split pin to make your crocodiles jaw snap, if not glue to whichever position you like.
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.
