



## **You will need;**

Card/paper

Paint

Pen

Scissors

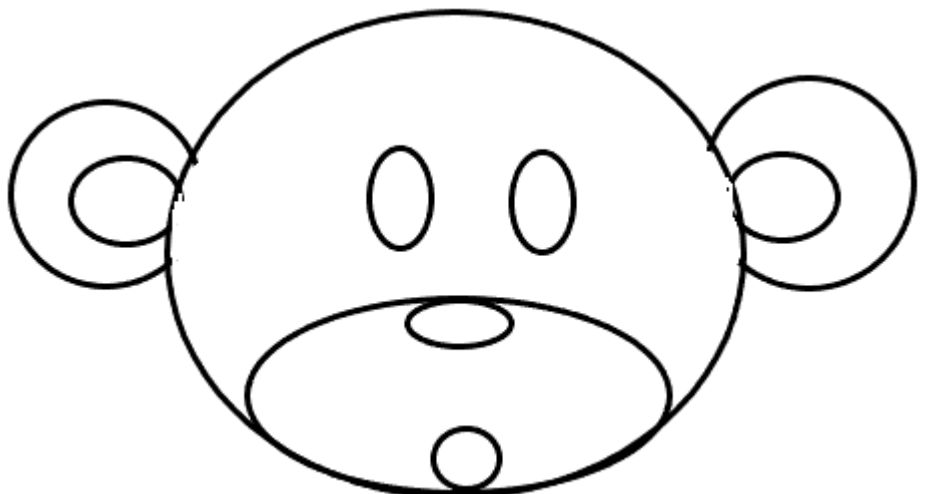
## **Optional;**

Other decoration

Googly eyes.

## **Directions**

- Draw a green line on a page to create a branch
- Add a handprint as shown above with the fingers overlapping the “branch”
- On a separate piece of paper/card draw the monkey face and colour in (suggested outline below)
- Once handprint is dry stick the face on and add the tail
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.





## **You will need;**

Card tube

Card/paper

Way to colour in.

Pen/ pencil

Glue/ tape

Scissors

## **Optional;**

Coloured card/paper

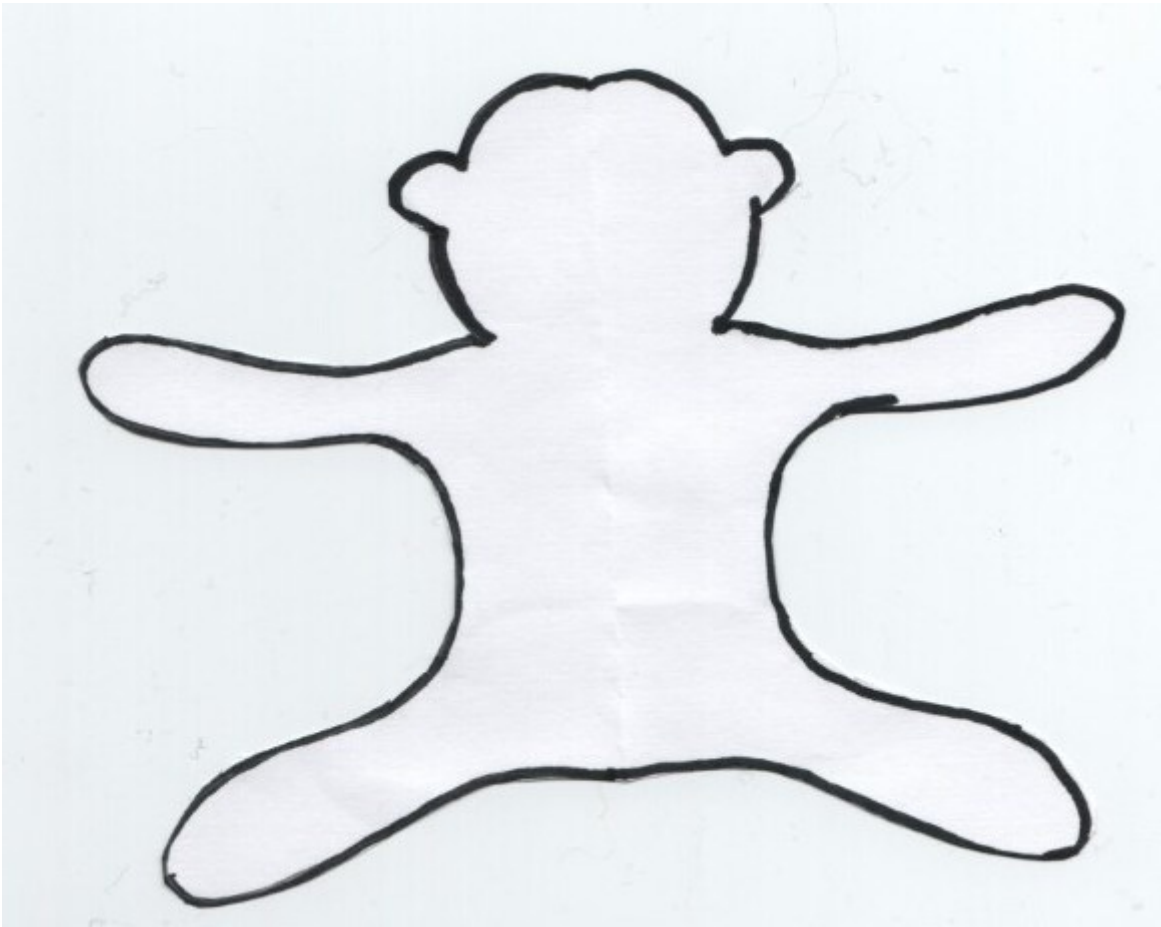
Glitter

Pipe cleaner/ribbon

Other decorations.

## **Directions**

- Cut out a monkey shape (template can be found below) if using plain card/paper colour in the monkey body
- Cut out a heart shape for the face.
- Cut out 5 leaf shapes, colour if needed.
- If you don't have a pipe cleaner or ribbon for the tail, use paper– match the colour to the monkey.
- If using paint– leave to dry before assembling.
- Attach the monkey to the tree, wrapping the arms around the trunk.
- Attach the heart shape and draw on a face, attach the tail.
- Attach the leaves by gluing them to the inside of the tube and then folding out down over the monkey.
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.







## You will need;

Scissors

Card or paper

Way to colour in.

Pen/ pencil

Glue/ tape

## Optional;

Paper plate

Googly eyes

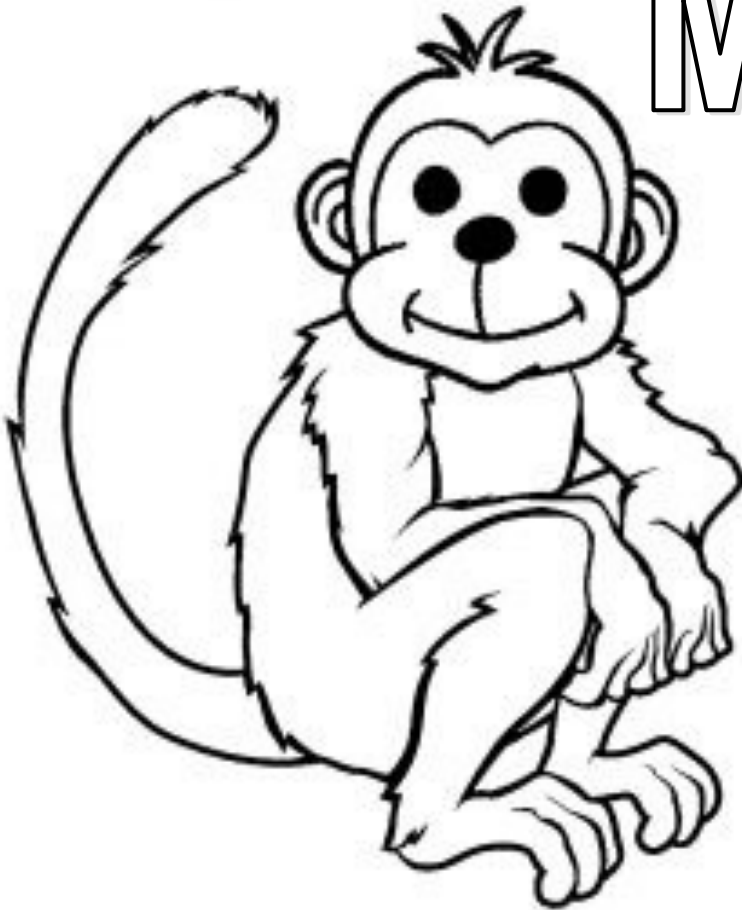
Glitter

Other decorations.

## Directions

- Colour in the face (paper plate or a piece of card/paper cut to size)
- Cut 2 small circles the same size out of card/ paper and colour the same as the face.
- Cut a larger circle for the muzzle colour a lighter colour than the face
- Cut out 2 small circles and colour to make eyes
- If using paint– leave to dry before assembling.
- Assemble your monkey as shown in the picture.
- Draw the mouth and two dots for nostrils onto the lighter circle
- Embellish with decorations if you wish.
